each of you is instrumental in making DRDH a welcoming and compassionate environment.



DRDH HOSTING COMMUNITY NEEDS ASSESSMENT SESSIONS TO HELP SHAPE FUTURE HEALTHCARE SERVICES

Deep River and District Health (DRDH) is inviting community members to participate in a comprehensive community needs assessment, designed to gather valuable feedback from residents to help shape the future of healthcare services in our area.

With two major capital projects underway at DRDH, the health campus will soon have new spaces available in the current 14-bed Four Seasons Lodge Long-Term Care Home and the North Renfrew Family Health Team building. This exciting transition brings an opportunity to repurpose these spaces to offer new services and programs or enhance those that are already active.

To make informed decisions on the best use of this opportunity, DRDH is hosting community input sessions as part

of a broader information gathering effort to gain insights directly from the people we serve.



"Our community's voice is essential to our planning process," said Janna Hotson, President and CEO of DRDH. "By engaging directly with residents, patients, and families, we aim to ensure that our future services meet the needs and expectations of those who rely on us most."

The community needs assessment will take place in November, coinciding with the Ottawa Valley Ontario Health Team's (OVOHT) regional data collection efforts. Together, these findings will play a key role in shaping DRDH's strategic direction over the coming years.

Three planned sessions will be held at the Deep River Library on November 18, 2024 from 6:30-8:30 PM, at the Chalk River Legion on November 19, 2024 from 6:30-8:30 PM, and finally a session co-hosted with the Petawawa Centennial Family Health Centre at the Petawawa Civic Centre on November 20, 2024 from 6:30-8:30 PM.

Each session will feature a brief presentation from a member of the DRDH executive leadership team, followed by a facilitated workshop to collect ideas, understand local healthcare gaps, and explore opportunities for the future.



Influenza season is here and it's time to get your vaccine!


The IPAC buggy will be out and about with doses for our DRDH team members daily from 2:00—3:00 pm.

CYBER NEWS

The Number of Ransomware Attacks Around the World Increased by 73%

The number of ransomware attacks around the world increased by 73% in 2023, according to a new report by the Institute for Security and Technology's Ransomware Task Force (RTF). These attacks opportunistically target orgs across all industries, but the hardest-hit sectors over the past two years have been construction, hospitals and health care, government, IT services and consulting, and financial services.

"Like last year, our data indicates that the construction and hospitals and healthcare sectors continue to be the top two sectors with the most incidents worldwide."

The RTF also observed a surge in ransomware groups using big-game hunting tactics. These attacks are targeted, sophisticated operations designed to cause maximum damage to high-value targets in order to extract a large ransom.

"As we enter the final three months of 2024, we anticipate an increase in 'big game hunting' tactics by ransomware groups—most notably CL0P—as cyber criminals adapt and create new ways to further extort ransomware victims," the researchers write.

Phishing remains a top initial access vector for ransomware actors.

"Many ransomware groups still rely on traditional, relatively unsophisticated means such as phishing to execute an attack," the researchers write.

Phishing attacks are deceptive attempts to trick you into revealing personal information or clicking harmful links, often disguised as legitimate emails or messages. To protect yourself and DRDH, always verify the sender's email address, avoid clicking unexpected links, and report any suspicious messages to our IT team.

RESIDENTS' COUNCIL CORNER

The Four Seasons Lodge Residents' and Family Council met on Thursday, October 17, 2024, for their monthly meeting. The Council reviewed the first draft of the resident-centered care video that our residents contributed to. The video will also be reviewed by those who were unable to attend the meeting or further input. Once finalized, the video will be shared as part of future education for our DRDH team members.

The Council also reviewed results of the annual Resident and Family Satisfaction Survey for 2024. A summary of results was provided, highlighting higher scoring categories including safety and security. privacy, and respect by staff. The lower scoring areas were also reviewed, which include personal relationships, staff-resident bonding, and activities. It was determined by the residents that the areas that received lower scores should be areas of focus for the Home as part of quality improvement planning. Additionally, daily decisions was identified as another area with room for improvement, based on feedback provided. Daily decisions will be further discussed to ensure there is more flexibility with schedules.

The Council also reviewed the Ministry of Long-Term Care Proactive Compliance Inspection Report, as well as the action plan to address findings. There was a discussion about the structure of the Residents' and Family Council, as there were four findings related to the structure in the report. It was noted that there will be upcoming updates made to the Terms of Reference and membership for the Council, as well as communication to family members on establishing a separate family council.

The Council also reviewed activities for November including more fall inspired taste of home recipes and knitting/crocheting club, as well as their meal choice of the month—which residents decided would be take-out pizza!

As part of an ongoing review of the Residents' Bill of Rights, the resident's reviewed right #1, "Every resident has the right to be treated with courtesy and respect and in a away that fully recognizes the resident's inherent dignity, worth and individual, regardless of race, ancestry, place of origin, colour, ethnic origin, citizenship, creed, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, age, marital status, family status or disability."
