#### CONNECTING WITH OUR DRDH TEAM AND COMMUNITY



As winter weather settles in, safe driving becomes more critical than ever. Whether you're commuting to work or running errands, here are some essential tips to help you navigate the roads safely this season:

**Equip Your Vehicle for Winter**—Ensure your car is ready for the season by installing winter tires, which provide better traction in snow and icy conditions. Check your tire pressure regularly, as it can drop in colder temperatures.

**Clear Your Vehicle Thoroughly**—Take the time to clear all snow and ice from your car, including the roof, windows, mirrors, and lights. This not only improves your visibility but also prevents snow from flying onto other vehicles and creating hazards.

**Drive Cautiously**—See snow? Drive slow! Reduce your speed and increase your following distance to account for slippery roads and reduced visibility. Accelerate and brake gently to avoid skidding, and take extra care on bridges and overpasses, which tend to freeze first.



# DIP TO DONATE POLAR PLUNGE RAISES OVER \$36,000 FOR CLOSER TO HOME CAMPAIGN

The icy waters of the Ottawa River proved no match for the determination of 50 participants who braved the chill on Saturday, December 7 to support our inaugural "Dip to Donate Polar Plunge". The event united individuals and teams from across the region to raise funds for the \$2.5 million Closer to Home campaign to furnish and equip the new 96-bed Four Seasons Lodge Long-Term Care Home currently under construction on the health campus. The plunge exceeded all expectations, raising over \$36,000.

The water was recorded at 3 degrees Celsius and the air temperature a brisk -8 degrees Celsius with wind-chill at the time of the dip. Dippers were not encouraged when told that the water was warmer than the air!

Among the standout fundraisers for the individual contest was Jay Serdula, who brought in over \$1,400 from friends and family and was rewarded with a stay at the Westin Trillium House at Blue Mountain Resort along with two ski passes. The team contest was won by The Tragically Frozen, consisting of Candace Bishop, Adrian Bishop, and Ed Aiston, who together raised more than \$3,100. They received a gift basket from Pembroke Hyundai, Canadian Tire, and Cahoon's Pharmsave.

A high point of the event came when Deep River & District Health President and CEO Janna Hotson and Deep River Mayor Suzanne D'Eon took the plunge together as the event finale, fulfilling their promise to dip if fundraising goals were met. Their participation drew cheers from the crowd and capped off an already spirited day.

I would like to offer special thanks to Rosehall Consulting, P&G Enterprises, MD Financial Management, Petawawa Toyota, Furniture King, Custom Draperies, Scotiabank Healthcare+, Northern Credit Union, Deep River Valu-Mart, the Town of Deep River Fire Department and Public Works, and many more sponsors, volunteers, and supporters.

Thanks to the success of this event, the campaign has reached 87 percent (\$2.2 million) of its goal. With the campaign in its final stretch, community members are encouraged to contribute to the cause.
